of the 5th Judicial District of Kentucky
and Judge of the Nelson Circuit Court
personally appeared Eppa Hubbard
aged 60 years Resident in said County
who being by me first duly sworn
according to law doth on his oath
make the following Declaration

That he the said Eppa Hubbard Entered
for the Term of two years in the month
of February 1846 in the Company commanded
by Capt G. S. Haughton of the 8th Regt
Regt. Commanded by Col. Muhlenberg
Served as a Sgt until about the 25th of
1849 when he Reentered for the Term
of three years in Capt Nicholas Moore
Comp^y of the 4th Regt of Light Dragoons
Commanded by Col. Stephen Moylan
and others
that he served as a Sgt in said
Regt until the month of Decr. 1850
when he was regularly discharged
from service at Lancaster in

the State of Pennsylvania, that
he was on the 10th of November

Eppa Hubbard a pensioner of the United States by Certificate dated the 14th day of March 1820 at the Rate of Eight dollar per month (was personally into the Court being a Court of Records and drew a Schedule of his Estate which he put valued at \$85 and which Hubbard made oath equally to pay. Whereupon it is ordered that the said Schedule doth be read and Certified true. On the 6th day of November 1821 personally appeared in open Court being a Court of Records for the County of Russell in the State of Kentucky, a Resident of said County 1 year thirty three years old being first duly sworn according to Law. doth on his oath make the following Declaration in Order to obtain the Provision made by the act of Congress of the 18th March 1818 and the 5th May 1820. That he the said Eppa Hubbard served in the Revolutionary War as follows. He in the early part of February 1776 enlisted, in Capt. George Claughtons Company in 8th Virginia Regiment Commanded by Col. Peter Muhlenberg on Continental Establishment, for two years. That he was on the 29th of June in South Carolina in the Battle on Muddy Island. On the 11th September at the Battle of Brandywine. On the 4th of October at the Battle of German Town and on the 24th of December 1777. He was discharged at Valley Forge. And on the same day recruited in the 4th Regiment of Light Dragoons Commanded by Col. Stephen Moylan and continued in said Regiment till late in December 1780 when the Regiment was sent into Winter Quarters at Lancaster in Pennsylvania where he received his final discharge. The Number of his Pension is 16560

And in pursuance of the act of the 1st May 1820 I do solemnly swear that I was a Resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818. And that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby to diminish it or to bring myself within the provision of an Act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18th day of March 1818; And that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed viz.
