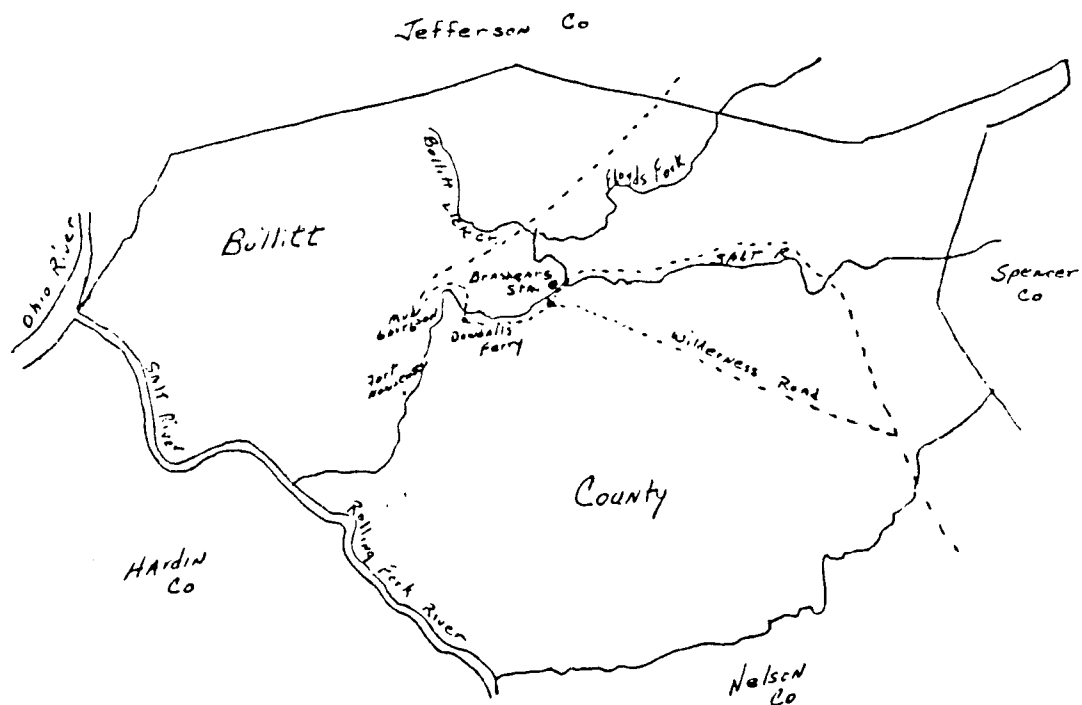

## The Quick Families of Bullitt and Jefferson Counties

The general belief has been that most Quick families of Kentucky are descendants of the original Dutch immigrants Theunis Thomaszen Quick and Belijtgen Jacobus that arrived in New Holland about 1630. Their descendants are described extremely well in the book "Genealogy of the Quick Family," written by Arthur Craig Quick in 1942. Several residents of Bullitt and Jefferson county are found within its 500 pages, although the parents are unknown in each case. Distance and inadequate communication make it easy to understand how these families could be descendants of, yet lost to the large clan in New York, New Jersey, and eastern Pennsylvania. Several pieces of information, taken together, indicate that the Kentucky Quick families of Jefferson/Bullitt, and Madison/Estill counties are quite closely related, and suggest they might not descend from the Dutch group. Evidence presented here supports this possibility. More specifically, members of the three original Quick families that settled south of Louisville are discussed. Many descendants of Dennis Quick are also listed, from the 1790's up through the 1910 census. If the descendants of these Kentucky Quicks can share family traditions or old documents, new evidence may point to their true ancestor of about 1750 in western Maryland.

### Kentucky Quick Families - Dutch or German ?

Theunis Thomaszen Quick's Scottish father or grandfather apparently moved to Holland in the 14th century, married a Dutch women, and remained there to raise a family, as explained in "Genealogy of the Quick Family." Somewhere around 1630, Theunis left Holland for New Holland with his own Dutch wife. By this time the Quick name had become altogether Dutch, which characteristic was preserved for several generations as the family grew in New York, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania. The European Quicks may have also expanded further, for at least two are known to have emigrated from Germany to America in the 1800's. A few English Quicks also came to America before 1750 as indentured servants or convicts sentenced to plantation labor, but their descendancy remains to be discovered.

"Genealogy of the Quick Family" shows that many of the Dutch clan became pioneers after the Revolutionary War, settling early in Michigan, Ohio, Illinois, and Indiana. Most migrations involved time spent in Pennsylvania, but one family line is shown passing through Washington county, Maryland in the 1780's, while on their way from New Jersey to Indiana. The five ancestors of most Kentucky Quick populations also spent time in this same area of western Maryland, and yet their connections are notably missing in the book. The five appear to be very closely related to each other, and although records do not show exactly where they came from, one is "of Germany." If this means "immigrant from Germany," then he and possibly the whole group are not part of the Dutch-American Quick family.

### The Kentucky Quick Families - Closely Associated at One Time

Benjamin, Jacob, Thomas, Andrew, and Dennis Quick are found on rolls of the 1776 Maryland militia of Washington county, then together again on one of the 13 lists comprising Washington county's 1778 "Oath of Fidelity" record. Dennis even named four of his sons after his associates. All five of these Maryland Quicks moved soon thereafter to Kentucky, and although they showed greater independence in the new state, their migration patterns are still interrelated.

Aaron Quick's Jr. and Sr. are also found on the 1778 "Oath of Fidelity" list. For these, there is no record of militia service or time spent in Kentucky, leaving their relationship to the others less certain.

### Benjamin and Jacob Quick - Madison County, Kentucky

Benjamin Quick is found on Madison county's tax records from 1790 to 1808. Jacob Quick is first there in 1792. Both families moved later to Missouri, with Jacob leaving about 1812. By good fortune, a short biography was written about Jacob well after his death, beginning "Jacob Quick, of Germany, ..., first settled in Maryland." While describing Jacob's family and their lives in Kentucky and Missouri quite well, it does not mention other Quicks or specify his exact connection with Germany. Of further interest is that Jacob also appears on the 1789 Jefferson county tax list along with Dennis and Thomas, and thereby again ties the Maryland group together.

A Tunis Quick also moved to Madison county in 1797, and remained until his death in 1809. Some records show he had spent time in North Carolina. Tunis had daughters, at least, who married and raised families in Kentucky. No Quick men appear to have remained for long in the area, as the name is not found in the records of Madison or Estill county after about 1830.

### Thomas Quick - Jefferson, Nelson, Bullitt, and Shelby Counties of Kentucky

Thomas is often found in various records that actually refer to Thomas Quirk, a much earlier

resident, defender, and landowner of Jefferson county. Born in Ireland, Mr. Quirk had lived for a time and married in mid-Virginia, was a revolutionary war officer in both east coast and Kentucky-Indiana-Illinois armies, then died at Louisville in 1803. Most references about this man indicate Quirk, but a few use Quick instead. In contrast, the real Thomas Quick has nothing written about him, has no Kentucky land records, and came from western Maryland. He is found in 1788 Jefferson county court records as a jury member, along with Dennis Quick. Records show that Thomas also spent time in Nelson county, and was taxed by Bullitt county in 1797, the year it was organized from Nelson and Jefferson counties. He then moved to neighboring Shelby county from 1799 to 1803, where his daughter Rachel married Nathaniel Adams on 12 Jul 1801. Three other Quick women married whose records do not mention a parent; they may also be daughters of Thomas. In Jefferson county, Eliza Quick married John Neighbours on 29 Sep 1796, and Ruth Quick married Jacob Eastwood on 18 Dec 1797. Rachel Quick married John Veal on 20 Sep 1803 in Shelby county. Very possibly, Thomas is the same as the one found on Indiana's Knox county (nearby at the time) 1807 territorial census, for no further Kentucky record seems to exist.

#### Andrew - the "Roving" Quick

From tax records, Andrew was in Jefferson county in 1791, then Nelson county until 1799. He had 50 acres at Longlick Creek in Breckenridge county from 1800-1802, after which he returned to Nelson county with 38 acres at Rolling Fork. 1807 finds him in Hardin county, then back to Nelson county for 1808-9. Finally, Andrew resided in Bullitt county from 1810 until about 1821. By analyzing the records of these counties and others in which his children roamed, I believe the family is as follows:

#### Dennis Quick - Bullitt County, Kentucky

Although no single record is available to prove that Dennis had seven sons, the few things left are consistent in supporting this. It is helpful that the family remained generally close to home, with many descendants still in place on the 1910 census. Their Bullitt county records are almost always associated with the Shepherdsville region, at locations like Floyd's Fork, Brooks Run, Bullitt's Lick, Blue Lick, and Brooks. Grandson Lemman's family lived farther west, near Pitts Point. Jefferson county involvements were usually just over the county line. Migration seems to begin after 1840, as some moved to or through Indiana.

Tax, census, and marriage records are generally available for Dennis Quick's family, and are supported, through 1900, by two death and several court records, three wills, and an 1803 lease agreement. Early tax lists show that Dennis' household included quite a few men (one year alone shows four of age 16-20). Their names appear as each becomes age 21. Dennis' alternate name is also learned there, as Tunis replaces Dennis four out of 31 tax years reported. Tunis' 1803 lease then fits in, which names his wife and also his son Samuel. The 1818 will of Jacob Quick names Samuel as his brother and executor, who also died that same year. Dennis' youngest son Ephraim is administrator of his estate in 1827. Three sons are thus fully tied to the family, and the rest are inferred from the tax records mentioned, supported by their consistent residency and presence at Dennis' estate auction.

The following family lists present a studied reconstruction of Dennis Quick's posterity from information found in books, periodicals, and microfilms at the Family History Library in Salt Lake City, Utah. ## JAMES MADISON CARPENTER

By Tom Pack

Prior to the change in the constitution of Kentucky in 1850, the county office of Justice of the Peace was filled by appointment. The court, composed of all Justices of the Peace in the county, would recommend two names to the Governor who would usually appoint the first named candidate as the new Justice.

The office of Justice of the Peace was important because the county court was made up of all the Justices. The number of Justices was determined by population and fixed by the legislature. A Justice remained in office until it was his turn to become sheriff after which he was no longer part of the court, being replaced by another person.

The constitution was changed in 1850 to allow the election of the Justices by a vote of the people. Elections were held every four years. A justice could be re-elected an unlimited number of times.

To be re-elected more than once would seem to be a feat that would be difficult unless one was respected by the people.

James Madison Carpenter was once such a Justice. He had been a member of the Bullitt County Court for twenty-three years and was the senior member in both years and term of service upon his death in 1884 (Order Book L,401). His fellow justices praised him by spreading upon the minutes "Resolved that in the death of James Madison Carpenter this court has lost its oldest and most valuable member, the county a good citizen an upright and fearless officer." Further the court said "---he filled the office of Justice of the Peace with fidelity and with honor to himself and usefulness to the County and the people. He was fair, generous, fearless and impartial in the administration of the trust confided to him by the people." (Order Book L,401)

James Madison Carpenter gave of himself in the discharge of his duties as Justice of the Peace. He contributed to the character of Bullitt County and by example set a standard that will be difficult to exceed.

## F R I G H T F U L   C A L A M I T Y

PIONEER NEWS, SHEPHERDSVILLE, KENTUCKY MARCH 31, 1922.

One of the most stressing and frightful occurrences in the history of our county was the destruction of the family and home of Mr. James Newman which took place last Tuesday night near Lebanon Junction. In some way which will never be known, there was an explosion caused by acetylene gas, and in a few moments the entire house was wrapped in roaring flames.

The members of the family escaped to the yard, when it was discovered that Mrs. Lucinda Newman, aged mother of Mr. James Newman was still in the house. Mrs. James Newman, with rare heroism went back into the burning house to rescue her. Her little nephew went with her and her son Harry Newman upon discovering that she was in the house, rushed in to bring her out, but just as he reached the top of the stairway he was met by a fierce blast of flames which threw him back on the floor terribly burned. He was rescued and carried out just as the house fell in carrying down into the awful furnace of flames, Mrs. James Newman, Mrs. Lucinda Newman and the little Spink boy. Their charred remains were taken from the ruins later. Harry Newman died in a few hours after his rescue. Mrs. James Newman, Harry Newman and the Spink boy were buried at Lebanon Junction, Thursday, while Mrs. Lucinda Newman was buried at Boston. We will publish full details in our next issue.

N.B. The next issue, that of April 7, 1922 did not have the story. And the remaining issues for April 1922 were missing from the microfilm lodged in the Ridgway Memorial Library at Shepherdsville.

FOUR LIVES ARE LOST WHEN FARM HOUSE BURNED  
FIRE FOLLOWS WHAT IS BELIEVED WAS EXPLOSION OF LEAKING GAS

Lebanon Junction, Kentucky March 29, 1922.

Four persons perished in a fire that destroyed the home of James Newman, three miles west of Lebanon Junction, at 11 o'clock Tuesday night. It was caused apparently, by the explosion of gas in the house.

The dead:

Mrs. Lucinda Newman, 87 years old, Mrs. Newman's mother.

Mrs. Emma Newman, wife of Mr. Newman.

Jimmie Spink, 12, grandson of Mr. Newman.

Harry Newman, 23, son of Mr. Newman.

Mr. Newman was burned slightly and his son, Walter burned about the hands and face and his hair badly singed in an effort to rescue those in the house who were sleeping on the second floor.

Walter Newman returned home about 10:30 o'clock, lighted a match in the front hall and an explosion of leaking gas followed. He gave the alarm but before he or any of the family were able to do anything in the way of extinguishing the blaze, the flames had completely enveloped the house.

The charred bodies of the two women and the boy were brought out early today. (Wed. Mar. 29, 1922)

Walter Newman brought out his brother, Harry, during the fire and carried him half a mile to the home of his uncle, Charles Newman. Harry Newman's clothing was burned off his body. He died at 4 o'clock this morning.

RETURNED TO HELP MOTHER.

Harry, (Newman) who had escaped from the burning house, returned to assist his mother and others from the building, was overcome by gas fumes leaking from the tank in the basement and was carried out by Walter, but not until he had suffered fatal burns.

Four generations succumbed in the fire. The Spink boy is a son of Fred Spink, L&N engineer, employed in Montgomery, Alabama. His mother (Ethel) is dead.

Mrs. James Newman has three sisters, Mrs. Mary Bishop, Mrs. Pat Daugherty and Mrs. Charles Newman, and three brothers in Missouri. She leaves two daughters, Mrs. E.M. Huffman and Mrs. Robert Brashear, and another son, Ezra, besides her other son Walter, and her husband. (JAMES)

Harry Newman will be buried here at 2:30 o'clock Thursday afternoon, with services conducted by the local Masonic lodge. Services for Mrs. James Newman and little Jimmie Spink will be conducted at the same time at the Lebanon Junction Baptist Church by the Rev. H.S. Bell of Louisville. The body of Mrs. Lucinda Newman will be buried at Boston, Kentucky Friday afternoon. (Little Brick Cem.)

Mrs. Harry Newman is in serious condition due to the shock of the fire and resulting death toll.

James Newman is one of the leading farmers of this section of Bullitt County. His son, Harry, also was prominently connected.
