Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your letter relative to one Lawrence Bishop, a soldier of the Revolutionary War.

The data contained herein are obtained from the papers on file in the Revolutionary War claim for pension, S.1166, based upon his military service in that war.

Lawrence Bishop, son of George Bishop, was born May 12, 1763 in Bedford County, Pennsylvania.

While a resident of Bethel Township, Bedford County, Pennsylvania, he entered the service in May 1780 as a substitute for his father, George Bishop, in Captain Henry Rush's Company and was stationed for two months at the town of Bedford as a guard by order of Colonel Woods of the Bedford County Militia. He entered the service in May 1781, served two months in Captain Thomas Davy's Pennsylvania Company and guarded the frontiers. He entered the service in August 1781 and served a tour of two months in Captain George Inlows' Pennsylvania Company.

In 1793 soldier moved from Bethel Township, Bedford County, Pennsylvania to Jefferson County, Kentucky and some years later moved to Bullitt County, Kentucky.

He was allowed pension on his application executed September 17, 1832 while a resident of Bullitt County, Kentucky.

No statement is made as to the marriage of soldier. There are no further family data, except the above reference to his father.
