In the army of the United States during the Revolutionary War

Inscribed on the Roll of Kentucky
at the rate of 8 Dollars per month, to commence on
the 8 of June 1818.

and sent to the Hon. M. Clegg,
Lexington, Ky.

To the Hon. John C. Calhoun Secretary of the
Department of War of the United States,

I Alfred Moteatt Circuit Judge in and
for the fifth Judicial District of the State of Ken-
tucky & sole Judge of the District Court in
said District, do certify this this day Henry
H. Bell ~~sees~~ ~~and~~ ~~came~~ ~~personally~~ ~~before~~ ~~me~~ &
declared under oath, that he is a citizen of the
United States & a resident of Bullitt County afo-
resaid, that in the Spring of the year 1776 he enlisted
as a soldier in the army of the revolution in Capt.
Robert Ballards company in the first Virginia
regiment, or continental establishment, com-
manded by Col. Francis Eppes, and served as
such about eleven months, and was then dis-
charged by Col. Glenn ~~North~~, and then enlisted
again, under Capt. John Grant, in the fourth
Virginia regiment commanded by Col. Robert
Lawson, to serve for two years, ~~during~~ all which
time he served as a soldier in said regiment and
was at the expiration of said two years, regular-
ly discharged by said Col. Lawson; that he was
in the battles of Germantown, Germantown and
Monmouth; that his discharge ~~is~~ ~~of~~ ~~record~~ ~~and~~
lost or destroyed; that he does not know that there
is any person living in Kentucky, by whom his
case establish the fact of his service as aforesaid; that
from his reduced circumstances he needs the assist-
ance of his country for support; & that he has never
been allowed a pension under the laws of the United
States. Given under my hand this sixth day of

On the 18th day of September 1820 personally appeared in open Court being a Court of Record for said County having power to fine and imprison for any Contempt offered it and its proceedings recorded by a Clerk according to the act of assembly Henry Jabel aged 61 years residing in said County and district afo^r who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he enlisted with Capt Robert Ballard at Charlott County Va in the regular service for one year in the first Va Regt at the commencement of the revolutionary War that after serving one year as afo^r he again enlisted with Capt John Blount at Charlott County for two years in the regular service in the 4th Va Regt and was afterwards discharged by Col Robert Lawson in the State of Jersey that during these two last years he was in the Battle of Brandywine Germantown & Monmouth. I do solemnly swear I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818, and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby to diminish it as to bring myself within the provision of an act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval services of the United States in the revolutionary war passed on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not now nor has any person in trust for me any property, or securities, contracts or debts due me, nor have I any income other than what is con-

lained in the schedule here to annexed and by me subscribed.

Schedule I do declare that he is destitute of money or property of any kind whatsoever, that he has about ten or twelve dollars or may be something more and that he has about as much owing to him and little more.

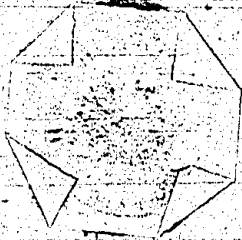

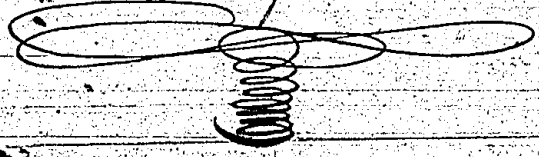

Dear Madam:

You are advised that it appears from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, S. 35461, that Henry Isbell enlisted in Charlotte County, Virginia, in the spring of 1776, and served as a private in Captain Robert Ballard's Company, Colonel Francis Eores' Virginia Regiment, length of service one year; he re-enlisted, date not given, served as a private in Captain John Brent's Company, Colonel Robert Lawson's Virginia Regiment, was in the battles of Brandywine, Germantown and Monmouth and served two years.

He was allowed pension on his application executed June 6, 1818, while residing in Bullitt County, Kentucky.

In 1820, he was aged sixty-one years and resided in Jessamine County, Kentucky. There are no data as to his family.
