To the Honorable John C. Calhoun Secretary of the
Department of War of the United States

I John P. Oldham Circuit Judge of the 1st
Judicial District of Kentucky, and sole Judge of the
Ballitt Circuit Court in said District do hereby
testify that this day Charles Langston came personally
before me and declared under oath that he is
a native of the United States and a resident
of Ballitt County aforesaid - that in the year 1779
or 1780 he enlisted in the Corps of Dragoons com-
-manded by Capt John Watts, in a Regiment com-
-manded by Col ~~John~~ White, on Continental establish-
-ment. That he served for some time in said
White's Regiment, and was then transferred to
Col Washington's Regiment of Dragoons; that after
Col Washington was taken prisoner at Cautin Springs,
the Regiment was commanded by Maj Swan -
that he served between three and four years,
and until the end of the War in 1783. That
all the Dragoons in said Regiment were permitted
by Maj Swan - to go home from Chastain
(Va) and were directed to apply at Richmond
(Va) for their discharges; but that he never applied
for his, and never obtained any discharge, that
none of the officers in said Regiment has in
Kentucky that from his Obedient Comemetary the
needs the assistance of his Country to support; and
that he has never been allowed any pension under
the laws of the United States or given under my hand
this 24th day of September 1819. Jno P. Oldham

State of Kentucky Public Account

Charles Langston a pensioner of the United States by Certificate dated the 6th day of May 1870 at Eight dollars per month came personally into this Court being a Court of Record and delivered a schedule of his debts which the Court valued at ninety dollars, and to which the said (Langston) made oath agreeably to Law, Whereupon it is ordered that the said schedule and oath be recorded and certified to the State of Kentucky. On the 18th day of September 1870 personally appeared in open Court being a Court of Record, for the County of Pulaski, by the summons Law and Statute Law of this State, Charles Langston aged about fifty eight or fifty nine years residing in said County who being sworn according to Law swore on his oath declared that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows: He was enlisted by a Lieutenant General at Hillsborough in North Carolina and sent to Halifax and was put in the Troop of Horse Commanded by Captain John Watts in the Regiment Commanded by (Which to which)

Evans was Major all of the Virginia Line on Continental Establishment in the year 1780. From Halifax he was sent to Lancaster in Virginia & afterwards was sent to South Carolina and placed in the Regiment called Col^o Mashington's Regiment. He was at the siege of York and then marched to South Carolina and served to the end of the War and was discharged at Charlestown. The number of his Pension is 10858 and the date of his original application was on the 24th day of September 1819. And I do solemnly swear that I was a Resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818. and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby to diminish it or to bring myself within the provisions of an Act of Congress entitled an Act to

provided for certain persons engaged in the land and
 naval service of the United States passed on the 18th
 day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has
 any one in trust for me any property or securities
 contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income
 other than what is contained in the schedule here
 annexed and by me subscribed. vizt. One horse
 sixteen or seventeen years old, seven good staff
 and between fifteen twenty coats, one plough,
 two hoes, one axe, one bed, bedstead furniture, six
 common chairs, six plates, six knives forks, 1 pewter
 dish & 2 spoons. The declarant is by occupation a
 farmer - His wife is aged about fifty eight years - she
 has been lame about thirty years, her health is not
 good. He has living with him two children a son
 & daughter. His daughter is about twenty three years old
 his son is sixteen, they are as healthy as ordinary
 persons. I do hereby declare this 18th day of
 September 1820 before the court aforesaid




"Know all men by these presents that we Charles Sandale & Robert Hawkins of the County of Prince Edward, are held and firmly bound to his Excellency the Governor of the State of Virginia in fifty pounds current money, to be paid to the said Governor or his successors, to the which payment well and truly to be made, we and our heirs, Executors or Administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents, sealed with our seals and dated this eighteenth day of December one thousand seven hundred and eighty eight. The Condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas there is a marriage shortly intended to be solemnized between the above bound Charles Sandale and Edith Burks (Spinster) daughter of Richard Burks, that if there be no lawful cause to obstruct the said marriage then this obligation to be void, or else to remain in full force and Virtue.

And I do hereby further certify that there is no register or certificate of marriage, filed in my office, solemnized between the said Charles Sandale and Edith Burks, named in the above

On the second day of August 1837 personally appeared before me undersigned a Justice of the Peace in and for said County Eda Langsdon a Resident of Jefferson County in the State of Kentucky aged seventy eight years on the 11th day of April 1837 (with being just, duly, advised according to Law of date on her oath to the following Relation in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed July 4. 1836 That she is the widow of Charley Langsdon who was a Soldier of the Revolutionary Army with the vicinity of the service of said Langsdon and she has no Documentary evidence in her possession proving said service. That she states that the said Charley Langsdon applied for a Pension under the act of Congress of the 18th March 1818, and furnished the War Department with all the proof necessary to place him on the Pension Roll of the United States which proof is now of file, as she believes, in the office of the Secretary of the War Department of the United States, to which she refers, on that proof the said Charley Langsdon was placed on the Pension list of the United States at the sum of Eight dollars per month during his Natural life as will appear by the Pension Certificate (which is attached) dated the 6th day of May 1820 and signed by J. C. Calhoun Secretary of War. She further declares that she was married to the said Charley Langsdon in Prince Edward County State of Virginia on the 15th day of December 1789 after said Langsdon had quit the Army that they moved from Prince Edward County Va to Kentucky and settled in Mercer County and lived there some years, then moved to Russell County Ky and lived there some years

then married to Jefferson County, Kentucky, on
 the 11th day of October 1831 and she has
 remained his widow ever since that period
 not having been married again as will
 more fully appear by the testimony here
 annexed it being the only proof of her condition
 produced without great inconvenience, trouble
 expense and delay, the register of marriages
 being at the time in Prince Edward County
 Virginia and she is the old person to procure
 a Certified Copy. Her father declares that said
 Charles Langston is a Prisoner as aforesaid, and
 having left Langston (residing in Bullitt County
 Ky) & Elizabeth married to Royal Langston, Mary
 Langston, William Langston (residing in Jefferson
 County Ky) and Charles Langston (who resides
 in the State of Ohio or Michigan) he
 swears that they were all over the age of twenty
 one year at the time of the death of said
 Charles Langston the Prisoner as aforesaid
 sworn to and subscribed on the day and year
 above written before me
 and I further certify that
 from the age of said infancy
 of the above named Eda
 Langston I believe that
 she could not consent to
 all the Court to make her
 Declaration
